PUBLIC INFORMATION SESSION

CEDARPOINT ANCHORAGE NEIGHBOURHOOD – PLAN FOR TRAFFIC CALMING AND ASPHALT RESURFACING

The City of Saint John will be installing a new traffic calming circle at the intersection of Cedarwood Drive and Birchdale Crescent. Also included will be the asphalt resurfacing of Cedarwood Drive, Birchdale Crescent and Rivershore Drive in 2019. Future asphalt resurfacing plans for the neighborhood will be provided at the information session.

In addition to the traffic calming circle and the asphalt resurfacing work, other features will be incorporated on Cedarwood Drive intended to calm traffic and allow for safer pedestrian passage.

- A centerline and two white sidelines will be painted to delineate driving lanes
- A 1.5m wide pathway will be created on one side of the street to allow for safe pedestrian passage
- 'Rumble strips' will be milled into the asphalt surface to provide some additional separation of pedestrian and vehicle traffic

Construction is planned to begin in late August and is expected to continue into September 2019. Prior to construction, another notice will be distributed to inform residents and business owners of the actual construction schedule. Although there will be traffic interruptions and changes/delays in traffic flow during construction, it is our intent to keep these inconveniences to a minimum.

This project is part of the City's ongoing commitment to continually improve its infrastructure.

This project is part of the 2019 City of Saint John General Fund Capital and Operating Programs.

Representatives from the City of Saint John and the traffic calming design team from Crandall Engineering Ltd. will be available to answer questions related to the project. The public is invited to attend an information session on this project on the following date and time:
