



Central Peninsula Plan: Approved Plan Boundary for Reference






The Central Peninsula is geographically composed of three neighbourhoods; the Uptown, South End, and Waterloo Village, significant waterfront spaces including the Central Waterfront, South Waterfront, and Long Wharf. Main, Union, and Crown Streets are identified in Plan SJ as Primary Corridors, with City Road identified as a Commercial Corridor and therefore receiving specialized treatment in the Secondary Plan.

North End Neighbourhood Plan: Proposed Plan Boundary





Incorporates 6 sub-neighbourhoods:

- Old North End
- Lansdowne
- Douglas Avenue/Main Street
- Somerset/Millidge Avenue
- Crescent Valley
- Mount Pleasant

Includes:

- Site of the new North End School
- Site of the New Brunswick Museum
- Vacant areas for new residential development
- Existing residential areas in decline

North End Neighbourhood Plan – Next Steps

- April 17: Launch the North End Neighbourhood Plan on Shape Your City
- April 17 to early May: Gather public feedback on the proposed Plan Boundary for approximately 2 weeks.
- May 13: Take the Terms of Reference to Common Council for adoption.
- Mid May: Issue RFP for Consulting Services to support development of the Plan
- Late May: Return to Growth Committee to receive endorsement on the Plan Boundary.
- Early June: Take the Plan Boundary to Common Council for endorsement.
